 - 12 major steps
 - Including ranking and adoption of the Plan locally
 - Local Plan Competitive/Ranking Process Options
 - High-Medium-Low or
 - Priority 1-30 or
 - Point System



October 2006

- Kentucky Workshop on Development of Human Service Coordinated Plan
- Statewide Kentucky Public Transit Meeting
 - Highest unemployed Counties
 - Transit to Hire and run additional vehicles in those counties to job related training and employment



Kentucky's Annual Unemployment Rate

- Statewide overall had a decrease of 5.17%
- Kentucky's trade, transportation and utilities sector added 6,300 jobs in 2007 and 11,300 over the past 10 years. It is the largest Kentucky sector with a total of 386,700 jobs.
